Description	Competitors will write a <u>short</u> creative essay/poem by exploring the selected theme.				
Purpose	To encourage students to express and improve their communication skills through creative writing.				
Eligibility & Entry	Chapter members in 9-12th grade, one entry per chapter The chapter must register their competitor for this competition via the registration form by the registration date .

Rules	 The chapter must register their competitors for this competition via the registration form before it closes. The competitor will write an essay/poem on the theme: <i>"Inspire, Influence, Impact".</i> The essay/poem must be in a vertical 8.5x11 inch format and must fit on one page utilizing Times New Roman 12pt font (double or single spaced allowed). The essay or poem will be judged on content, organization, structure, grammar and appearance. The essay/poem must be submitted on Headrush. All essays and poems will become the property of Jobs for Arizona's Graduates, National Career Association, and the Arizona Career Association. The competitors grant permission for the use of it in various publications, etc.
